- 1. Water and Moisture The unit should not be used near water. For example: near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool or in a wet basement.

For example, it should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block ventilation openings. 


E.The unit does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.



The remote control battery is already installed at the factory. When the remote control stops operating or its range seems reduced, it is time to replace the battery with a new one.

- 1. The battery door is located on the back end of the unit.
- 2. Slide the battery door open and remove old battery.
- 3. Insert a CR2032 battery, checking that the + and ends of the battery match the drawing inside the battery compartment.
- 4. Replace the battery door.

Note: Make sure you dispose of battery properly (see your local regulations).

The Remote Control controls basic functions on the Ti700 and certain iPod functions when the iPod is docked in the Ti700. For best results, aim remote control towards the remote sensor on the upper right corner of the unit.



#### To check for iPod compatibility

The Ti700 is an advanced system and supports most updated iPod features. To ensure your iPod works properly with the Ti700, please update your iPod firmware with the latest version. Please check the Apple website (www.apple.com) for updates.

#### Install/Replace Clock Battery Backup

The Ti700 used 2 "AA" batteries backup battery system to provide continuous alarm operation and clock settings in the event of a power failure. If the Backup Battery has been installed and a power failure occurs or the AC adaptor is accidentally disconnected, the display backlight will not remain lit, but the current time and alarm time settings will be temporarily maintained. Otherwise, you must reset the time and alarm settings.

If the unit has no display or the Backup Battery Low Icon located on the top of the display is flashing, it is time to replace the backup batteries.

- 1. Please make sure the AC adaptor is connected. Otherwise all settings may be lost during battery replacement.
- 2. Open backup battery compartment cover located on the bottom of the unit.
- 3. Insert two "AA" batteries, checking that the polarity (+ and ends of the batteries) matches the drawing near the battery compartment. Close the compartment cover.

#### Maintenance

- Place the unit on a level surface away from sources of direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Protect your furniture when placing your unit on a natural wood and lacquered finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between it and the furniture.
- Clean your unit with a soft cloth moistened only with mild soap and water. Stronger cleaning agents, such as Benzine, thinner or similar materials can damage the surface of the unit.

#### **Daylight-Saving Time**

This unit is a preset Clock: the clock is already preset to Eastern Standard Time. It's simple to match settings to where you live.

- 1. Set the **6 DST Switch** to +1. The DST icon will appear on top of display and the time will advance 1 hour.
- 2. Set the **10 DST Switch** to -1 to set the time back 1 hour.

#### Auto-Set Time and Date Settings

This model is equipped with an Auto-Set feature; the time and date have been set for Eastern Standard Time at the factory.

- 1. To change your time zone setting, press and hold the **()** Time Zone Button. The current time zone will flash briefly at the bottom of the display, then revert to the standard date display.
- 2. While the Time Zone is flashing, press the <sup>(3)</sup> << and <sup>(9)</sup> >> **Button** to select your time zone. The time display will show the current time for the selected time zone. There are seven zones to choose from:
- ATL Atlantic Standard Time
- EAS Eastern Standard Time
- CEN Central Standard Time
- MTN Mountain Standard Time
- PAC Pacific Standard Time
- ALS Alaskan Standard Time
- HAI Hawaiian Standard Time

#### Setting Time and Calendar

- Press and hold the **①** Clock Adjust Button located on the back of the unit for 2 seconds until the time display flashes. If the time is correct, press the **①** Clock Adjust Button again to accept the setting. Otherwise, press the **③** << or **④** >> Button to adjust the time (hold for a few seconds to advance or reverse rapidly). Remember to set the correct AM or PM time. (An icon at the upper right hand corner of the display is the PM Indicator; there is no AM indicator). When the correct time is displayed, press the Clock Adjust button to confirm. The year display will flash.
- Press the ① Clock Adjust Button to accept the current year setting or press the ③ << or ④ >> Button until the correct year is displayed. Press the ① Clock Adjust Button to confirm year setting after adjustment.
- 3. The display will change to show the date flashing. Press the **①** Clock Adjust Button to accept the current date setting or press the **③** << or **④** >> Button until the correct date is displayed (holding the button for a few seconds will advance or reverse rapidly). Press the **①** Clock Adjust Button to confirm the date setting after adjustment. You will hear 2 beeps indicating that clock and calendar setting is complete and it will exit the setting mode.

#### **Operating the Dual Alarm System**

**Note:** The Ti700 has a dual alarm feature allowing you to wake to the iPod / Buzzer or Radio. The buzzer alarm will still sound in the event of power failure, if backup batteries are installed.

#### Setting the Alarm(s)

- 1. Press and hold the **2** Alarm 1 Button for 2 seconds until the display flashes. Press the **8** << or **9** >> Button to set the alarm time. Remember to set the correct AM or PM time.
- 2. Press the **2** Alarm 1 Button again or wait for 10 seconds. Alarm 1 is now armed, indicated by the numbered alarm clock icon.
- 3. To set Alarm 2, just repeat steps 1 and 2 above but using **6** Alarm 2 Button.
- 4. Set the **Wake-to Switch** located on the back of the unit to wake to radio or iPod/Buzzer (if no iPod is docked/detected, the alarm source will be the buzzer alarm). Both alarms (1 and 2) will wake you to same sound source. **NOTE:The radio alarm will wake you to the currently tuned band and station**.

#### Review, Arming and Disarming Alarm (Turn Alarm Function On and Off)

- 1. Press the **2** Alarm 1 (or Alarm 2) Button once. The display will show the current alarm time on the bottom part of the display for alarm time review.
- 2. During alarm review, press the button again to arm or disarm the alarm. When the alarm is armed, the related alarm icon appears in the display.

#### Resetting the Alarm to Come on the Next Day

1. When the alarm is sounding, press the **O** Alarm Reset/Power On/Off Button to stop the alarm sound and reset it to come on the following day.

#### Snooze

1. Press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** after the alarm sounds. The alarm will be silenced and come on again approx. 9 minutes later. Snooze can be pressed several times during the 1 hour alarm cycle.

#### **Charging Your iPod**

Note: Please make sure you are using the correct insert for your iPod (see Install iPod Insert) and that it is properly docked into the Ti700. Failure to do so may damage your iPod or the connector.

1. While your iPod is docked in the unit and the unit is connected to AC power, it recharges until fully charged. Note that other non-docking iPods will NOT charge.

#### Listening to Your iPod

- Dock an already playing iPod, the Ti700 will automatically turn on and you will hear the music playing from your iPod. Note: If the playing song/music loudness on the iPod itself is too low, Ti-700 may not detect the iPod is in play mode. Press the 1 iPod Play/Pause Button on the Ti700 or remote control twice to play it.
- 2. When the iPod is docked and in standby mode, press the **1** iPod Play/Pause Button on the Ti700 or remote control to play it. The iPod Icon will appear on the display, showing iPod playing mode.
- 3. Press the **1** iPod Play/Pause Button again to pause play; press again to resume it.
- 4. Press the **3 Volume+** and **4 Volume- Button** on the Ti700 or remote control to adjust the system volume.
- 5. Press **8** << or **9** >> **Button** on the Ti700 or remote control to go to the previous or next track. Press and hold while a track is playing for high speed forward or reverse music search of the current track.
- 6. To turn off the unit, press the **Alarm Reset/Power On/Off Button** on the Ti700 or remote control to turn it off. The iPod will continue charging while in the dock.

#### Listening to non-docking iPod or other portable audio devices

If you are using an iPod without a docking port or another MP3 player or other portable audio device, you can still play it through the Ti700 via the Line-in Jack. **NOTE: you cannot charge a device through the line-in jack.** 


- 1. Plug one end of the audio patch cord (included) into the headphone or line-out jack on your device and the other end of the patch cord into the Ti700 (B Line-in Jack, located on the back of the unit.
- 2. Press **1** iPod Play/Pause Button on the Ti700 or remote to turn the Ti700 on. The iPod Icon will appear on the top of the display, indicating Line-in playing mode.
- 3. Turn on and play your device.
- 4. Press the **3 Volume+** and **4 Volume- Button** on the right of the Ti700 or use the remote control to adjust the system volume. You may need to adjust your device volume, too.
- 5. To turn off the unit, press the **O** Alarm Reset/Power On/Off Button on the Ti700 or remote control to turn it off. Please remember to turn off your device, too.

#### Setting up the Antenna

- 1. Snap the included AM antenna cable into the **O** AM Loop Antenna Socket located on the back of the Ti700. Move the antenna 12" away from unit for best reception.
- 2. Extend FM wire antenna fully for best reception. Do not strip, alter or attach to other antennas.

#### Tuning and Playing the Radio

1. Press the **③ Radio Button** to select radio play mode, and as needed to select AM, FM1 or FM2 radio band. The "radio" indicator will appear at the bottom of the display, showing radio playing mode.



- 3. To memorize the current station as a preset, press and hold **3 Preset Buttons** 1, 2 or 3. Repeat step 1-3 to preset up to 9 stations (3 AM and 6 FM). To listen to a preset station at any time, simply press the desired preset button.
- 4. Press the **B Volume+** and **B Volume- Button** on the Ti700 or remote control to adjust the system volume.
- 5. To turn off the unit, press the **O** Alarm Reset/Power On/Off Button on the Ti700 or remote control to turn it off.

#### Sleep Operation

Sleep mode lets you sleep to your iPod or the radio, gradually lowering the volume until the unit shuts off at the selected time.

- 1. Press the **Sleep Button** to enter sleep mode. The **Sleep Icon** will appear on top of the display to indicate the unit is in sleep mode. Sleep mode has a Gentle Sleep feature which gradually lowers the volume.
- 2. You can adjust the sleep timer from 120, 90, 60, 30 or 15 minutes by pressing the button again. The unit will automatically turn off after the selected time.
- 3. When the display changes back to show the real time, press the **(b)** Sleep Button once to show the sleep time remaining. Pressing it again will change sleep time to the next lowest increment.
- 4. The Ti700 has an independent volume setting for sleep mode so you can adjust the sleeping volume without affecting the alarm volume. Press the **19 Volume** + and **10 Volume Button** on the Ti700 or remote control to adjust the sleep volume. The sleep volume will remain at that level the next time you enter sleep mode until controls are changed.
- 5. To stop listening at any time, press the **O** Alarm Reset/Power On/Off Button on the Ti700 or remote control to turn it off.

#### **Dimmer Operation**

During normal operation, press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** to control the brightness of the LCD display.



## Trouble Shooting
